

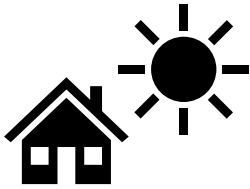

WARNINGS

Setting Up Wi-Fi

IrisVision can be configured to connect to your Wi-Fi. A Wi-Fi connection allows our Customer Support team to assist you more efficiently, as well as allowing you to use Video Player mode.

NOTE: IrisVision does not require Wi-Fi to function.

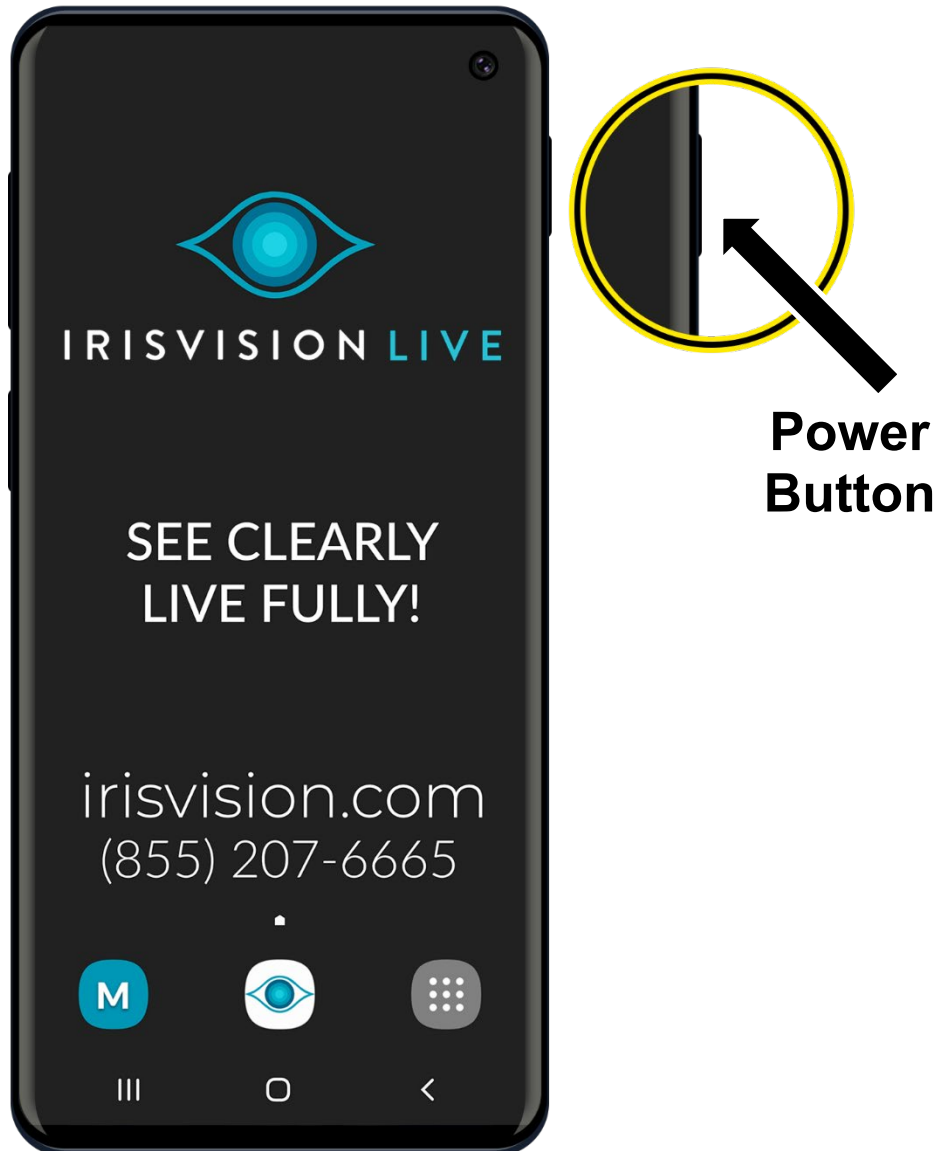
Step 1: Removing the IrisVision Display Unit from the Headset

Release the IrisVision Display Unit from the headset by pushing the clip (shown below) away from the Display Unit. Carefully remove the Display Unit and set aside the headset.

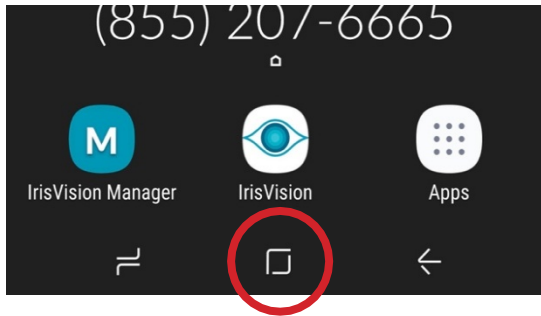


Step 2: Powering on the Display Unit

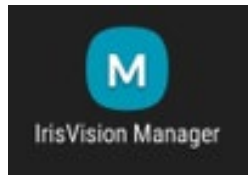
Press the Power button on the right side (see the picture below).



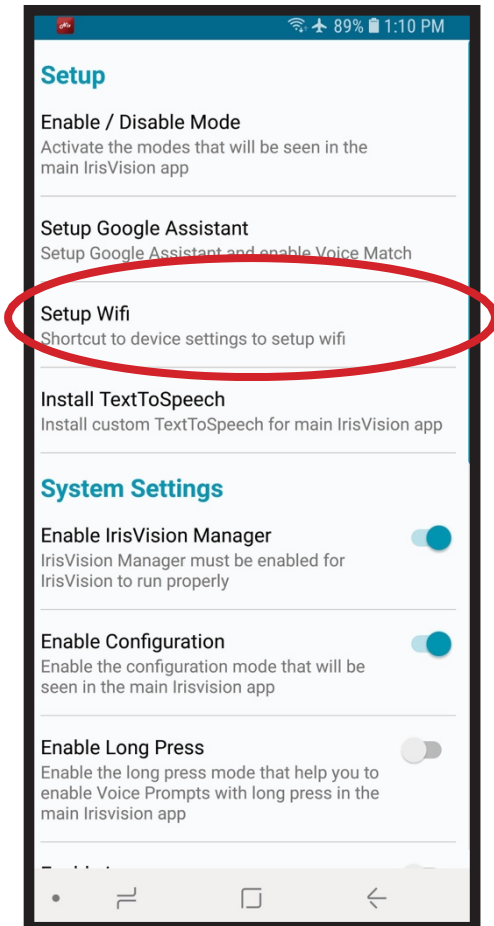
Step 3: Configuring Wi-Fi



- Go to the Home screen. Swipe up from the bottom of the screen and press the small white rectangular box.

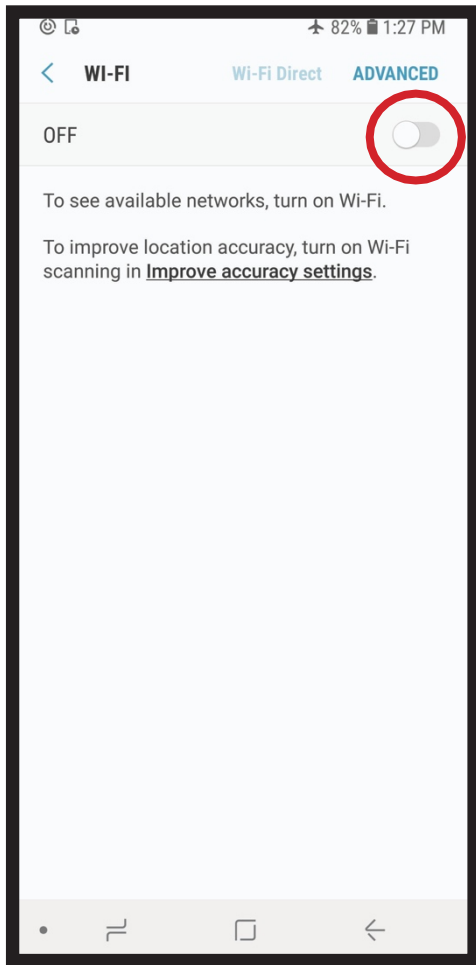


- Tap **IrisVision Manager** app.



- Tap **Setup Wifi**.

Step 3: Configuring Wi-Fi – continued



- Turn on Wi-Fi.

Step 3: Configuring Wi-Fi – continued



- Select your network, and then enter your password.

NOTE: IrisVision does not require Wi-Fi to function, Wi-Fi is required to use Alexa and Video Player.

Step 4: Connecting the Display Unit to the Headset

1. Insert the Display Unit into the headset by matching the yellow dots as shown below.



2. Securely lock the Display Unit into the headset by pushing the Display Unit against the spring lock, as shown below.



NOTE: When the Display Unit is connected correctly to the headset, it will say “**Device inserted correctly.**” If there is no verbal confirmation, the Display Unit is not connected correctly and the headset controls will not work. Ensure that the device speaks before you close it securely into the headset.

Wireless Charging Pad Instructions

Your IrisVision will take approximately 5 hours to fully charge and will automatically return to Focus mode when powered on.

NOTES:

- Please make sure that your headset is powered on and the Display Unit is installed into the headset.
 - The headset does not go to sleep in Television mode. Charging while in Television mode is not recommended.
1. Plug the Wireless Charging Pad into an electrical outlet.
 2. Center the IrisVision headset face down on the wireless Charging Pad. If voice prompts are enabled, you will hear a verbal prompt, and a solid red light will illuminate on the charging pad when the headset is properly placed on the charging pad.
 3. If you **DO NOT** hear this tone or see any illumination:
 - The headset contains a proximity sensor to determine if it is in use. Please place the straps outside of the headset while it is charging to ensure that the sensor is not activated.
 - Remove the Display Unit from the headset and place the back of the Display Unit (not the screen) directly onto the pad instead. For instructions on removing the Display Unit, see page 13.

The screen will turn black few minutes after you set the headset on the charger. When the Display Unit is fully charged, the red light on the charging pad changes to green and you will hear a verbal prompt, “**Charging completed**” (if voice prompts are enabled).

While the headset is charging, the charging pad will emit a solid red light (circled).



When the headset is fully charged, the charging pad will emit a solid green light (circled).



If the red light is not on or if it is flashing, the headset is not charging. Please remove your headset and reposition it until the light remains solid red.

The IrisVision's battery lasts 3 hours. It can last 3+ hours without continuous use, and all day (8 to 10 hours) on standby. You can make the most of this time by powering the headset off when you are not using it.

Powering the IrisVision Using the Magnetic Braided Power Cable

As an alternative to using the built-in battery to operate your IrisVision, you can connect the headset to an external cell phone battery (not included) using the magnetic braided power cable. This method is useful when you want to watch videos and television; it provides continuous power to the headset without draining the battery in the Display Unit.

NOTES:

- As long as the built-in battery has at least a 50% charge, using this method holds the existing charge.
- This method does not charge the built-in battery.
- The headset may overheat. If it overheats, disconnect the cable and let the headset cool down.
- Do not place an overheated headset on the Wireless Charging Pad until it has cooled down for at least 15 minutes.

IrisVision Display Unit



Using IrisVision: Step 1 – Powering On

Power on the Display Unit by pressing the white tab down for 5 seconds. A vibration will indicate that the headset is powering on.



Using IrisVision: Step 2 – Wearing the Headset

The headset's buttons and touchpad will not work when the headset is not worn on your head. We recommend that you wear your prescription distance glasses while using the headset.

1. Place the headset over your eyes and pull the straps back over your head.
2. Adjust the straps and secure them using the VELCRO® brand fasteners to achieve the best fit.

NOTE: Do not walk around while wearing the IrisVision headset.



Using IrisVision: Step 3 – Setting Up Focus

Slowly spin the focus wheel on the top center of your headset to adjust the focus, similar to adjusting binoculars.

1. After powering on your headset, it should automatically show Focus mode. It contains an image with beach chairs. If you are not in Focus mode, press the Mode button until you hear “Focus” and see the large bold letters.



2. Reset the focus by rotating the wheel as far left as possible.
3. Slowly begin adjusting it by rotating the wheel towards the right until the object is in focus. You can rotate the wheel in either direction as needed.
4. Pick an object at least 4 feet away to look at through your screen. Try looking at a picture on the wall or a family member's face.

Using IrisVision: Step 4 – IrisVision Modes

Your IrisVision headset comes with 5 default modes:

After adjusting the focus wheel, press the Mode button to enter the first mode, called “Scene”. Press once more to enter Television mode.

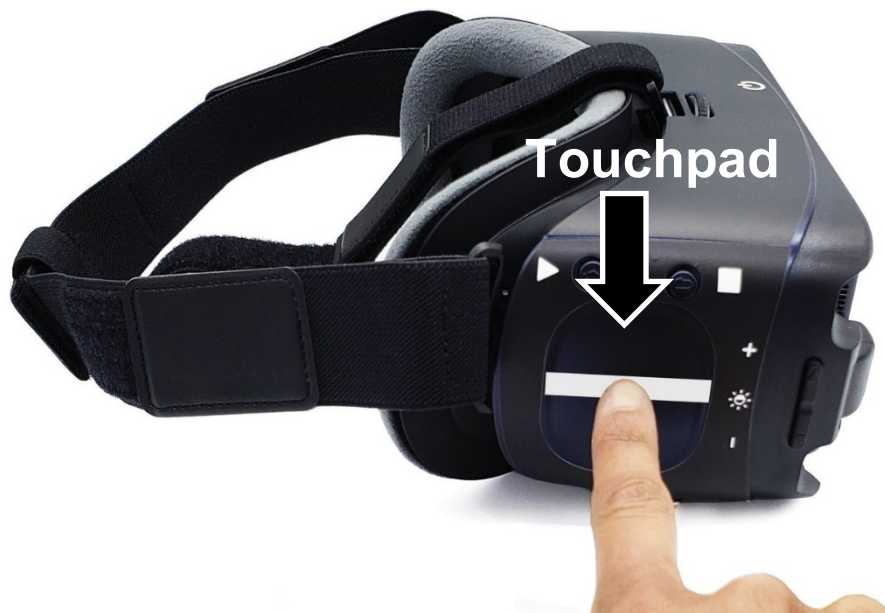
Using IrisVision: Step 5 – Zoom In and Zoom Out

IrisVision allows you to magnify your live view.

1. Locate the touchpad. The touchpad is located on the right side of the headset under the Mode and Snapshot buttons.
2. Place your right index finger on the touchpad. We recommend putting your hand in a fist with your index finger pointed out to steady your hand on the touchpad.
3. To zoom in, use your index finger to make a slow swiping motion on the touchpad straight towards your ear to increase magnification.

Important! You must take your finger off the touchpad between each swipe.

4. To zoom out (decrease magnification), use your index finger to swipe slowly on the touchpad straight away from your ear.



Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- **Say “Zoom In”**
- **Say “Zoom Out”**
- **Say “Set Zoom X” X = value between 1-12.**
- **Say “Max zoom” – zooms in to 12x magnification**
- **Say “Low zoom” – goes back to 1x magnification**
- **Say “Zoom” – gives the current magnification level**

Snapshot

The Snapshot button allows you to save a photo of your view in any live mode. A list of the live modes can be found on page 30.

1. Locate the Snapshot button. The Snapshot button is located to the left of the Mode button.
2. Press the Snapshot button, and the image you are viewing will freeze. A yellow camera icon will appear in the upper-right corner of the screen.
3. Magnify the Image. Zoom in or out by swiping on the touchpad.
4. Pan. To get a better look at a specific area in a snapshot, move your head up, down, left, and right.
5. Save. Press the Snapshot button again to prompt the save or discard screen. Swipe up on the touchpad to save and swipe down to discard. View your saved snapshot by cycling to Photo Gallery mode.

NOTE: Snapshots can be taken only in Live View modes.



Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.

Double Tap on the Touchpad

- Say “Take Snapshot”
- Say “Exit Snapshot”



Voice Commands

Voice Commands

NOTE: Activate voice prompt and give the command. Remember to wait for the audio beep or the image of a microphone to appear.

General Commands

- Say “**IrisVision Assistant**” for general instructions on how to use the IrisVision headset controls.
- Say “**Voice Command Help**” for instructions on how to use voice commands.
- Say “**Go to sleep**” to put the headset to sleep when prompted.
- Say “**Shut down**” to turn off the headset when prompted.

Information Commands

- Say “**Info**” for information on the current mode name, the battery level, the volume level, the magnification level, and the brightness level.
- Say “**Battery**” for the current battery level.
- Say “**Volume**” for the current volume level.
- Say “**Zoom**” for the current magnification level.
- Say “**Brightness**” for the current brightness level.
- Say “**Mode name**” for the name of the current mode.
- Say “**Serial number**” for the serial number of the headset.

Mode Navigation Commands

NOTE: If a mode is disabled, you will not have access to that mode. If you want to activate a mode that is not responding, please email support@irisvision.com or refer to the Configuration Guide.

- Say “**Next**” to navigate forward to the next mode.
- Say “**Back**” to navigate to the previous mode.
- Say “**Scene**” to navigate directly to Scene mode.
- Say “**Scene with Bubble**” to navigate directly to Scene with Bubble mode.
- Say “**RP**” to navigate directly to RP mode.
- Say “**Television**” to navigate directly to Television mode.
- Say “**Bioptic**” to navigate directly to Bioptic mode.
- Say “**Reading**” to navigate directly to Reading mode.
- Say “**Reading Inverted**” to navigate directly to Reading Inverted mode.
- Say “**Reading Line**” to navigate directly to Reading Line mode.
- Say “**Reading Green**” to navigate directly to Reading Green mode.
- Say “**Reading Yellow**” to navigate directly to Reading Yellow mode.
- Say “**IrisReader**” to navigate directly to IrisReader mode.

- Say “**Photo Gallery**” to navigate directly to Photo Gallery mode.
- Say “**Video Player**” to navigate directly to Video Player mode.

Adjusting Zoom / Magnification

- Say “**Set Zoom to <number>**” to set magnification to a specific level (1 to 14). Example: Say “**Set Zoom to 7**”.
- Say “**Zoom In**” to increase magnification by 1 (maximum 14).
- Say “**Zoom Out**” to decrease magnification by 1 (minimum 1).
- Say “**Max Zoom**” to set magnification to the highest level.
- Say “**Low Zoom**” to set magnification to the lowest level.

Adjusting Brightness

- Say “**Set Brightness to <number>**” to set brightness to a specific level (1 to 15). Example: Say “**Set Brightness to 8**”.
- Say “**Increase Brightness**” to increase brightness by 1 (maximum 15).
- Say “**Decrease Brightness**” to decrease brightness by 1 (minimum 1).
- Say “**Max Brightness**” to set brightness to the highest level.
- Say “**Low Brightness**” to set brightness to the lowest level.

Adjusting Volume

- Say “**Set volume to <number>**” to set volume to a specific level (1 to 15) Example: Say “**Set volume to 10**”.
- Say “**Increase volume**” to increase volume by 1 (maximum 15).
- Say “**Decrease volume**” to decrease volume by 1 (minimum 1).
- Say “**Max volume**” to set volume to the highest level.
- Say “**Low volume**” to set volume to the lowest level.

Adjusting Contrast

- Say “**Set contrast to <number>**” to set contrast to a specific level (1% to 100%).
- Say “**Increase contrast**” to increase contrast by 5%.
- Say “**Decrease contrast**” to decrease contrast by 5%.
- Say “**Max contrast**” to set contrast to the highest level.
- Say “**Low contrast**” to set contrast to the lowest level.
- Say “**Reset contrast**” to set contrast to 50% (default).

Adjusting Text-to-Speech Speed (applies to all modes)

- Say “**Increase speed**” to increase the speed of the readout.
- Say “**Decrease speed**” to decrease the speed of the readout.

Enabling and Disabling Voice Prompts

- Say “**Enable voice prompts**” to enable voice prompts for speech notification – as “device inserted correctly”, “charging confirmation”, “battery level”, and so on.
- Say “**Disable voice prompts**” to disable voice prompts for speech notification.

Mode-Specific Commands

- Say “**Help**” for general instructions on how to use the current mode.
- Say “**Turn on flashlight**” to turn on the flashlight (if the mode allows).
- Say “**Turn off flashlight**” to turn off the flashlight (if the flashlight is on).
- Say “**Take photo**” to take a photo in any mode that supports snapshot.
- Say “**Exit photo**” to exit full-screen photo view.

Television Mode Voice Commands

- Say “**Set exposure to <value>**” to set the exposure compensation to any of the following available values:
 - “**Theater**” is the default value.
 - “**Ambient**” is normal camera exposure.
 - “**Very Dark**” is 3 levels below ambient.
 - “**Dark**” is 2 levels below ambient.
 - “**Dim**” is 1 level below ambient.
 - “**Bright**” is the brightest value.

- Say “**Increase exposure**” to increase the television exposure compensation up 1 level.
- Say “**Decrease exposure**” to decrease the television exposure compensation down 1 level.
- Say “**Save exposure for television <1 or 2 or 3>**” to save the television exposure compensation to the defined TV preset (3 available presets).
- Say “**Set exposure television <1 or 2 or 3>**” to set the television exposure compensation to the value that was saved in the TV preset.
- Say “**What is the current exposure?**” for the current exposure compensation value.

IrisReader Mode Voice Commands

Say “**Take photo**” to begin the Optical Character Recognition (OCR) readout. For more information, see “IrisReader” on page 64.

Photo Gallery Mode Voice Commands

- Say “**Next photo**” to highlight the next photo in the list.
- Say “**Previous photo**” to highlight the previous photo in the list.
- Say “**Open photo**” to open the photo for full-screen viewing.
- Say “**Reset photo**” to re-center the photo.
- Say “**Exit photo**” to exit and go back to the Photo Gallery.
- Say “**Delete photo**” to delete the photo from the Photo Gallery when prompted.

Video Player Mode Voice Commands

- Say “**Next video**” to highlight the next video in the list.
- Say “**Previous video**” to highlight the previous video in the list.
- Say “**Play**” to play the selected video.
- Say “**Next category**” to navigate to the next playlist.
- Say “**Previous category**” to navigate to the previous playlist.
- Say “**News**” to navigate to the “News” playlist.
- Say “**Entertainment**” to navigate to the “Entertainment” playlist.
- Say “**IrisVision**” to navigate to the “IrisVision” playlist.
- Say “**Save video**” to save a video to the Bookmarked list when prompted.
- Say “**Remove video**” to remove a video from the Bookmarked list when prompted.
- Say “**Show saved videos**” to navigate to the Bookmarked list.

Accessing the Configuration Menu

Say “**Configuration menu**” to open the Configuration menu.

NOTE: Voice commands are set to respond to a double tap by default. A manual “long press” option is available. To activate this option, please refer to the Configuration Guide or contact Customer Support by email at support@irisvision.com or by phone at +1-855-207-6665.

Alexa Integration

You can initiate a conversation with Alexa and get real-time information such as:

- News
- Weather
- Sports Updates
- Facts
- Jokes
- Stories

Currently not supported:

- Playing music or audiobooks
- Ongoing conversations
- Integration with smart devices
- Purchasing, Alexa echo calls
- Any conversation that requires opening another application. For example, “Show me directions to the nearest Wal-Mart”.

Amazon Alexa Setup

This is intended to help you either set up your own personal Amazon account or create an Amazon account in order to use the built-in Alexa feature with your IrisVision headset.

Please follow these instructions if you already have an Amazon Alexa account.

Signing into an Existing Amazon Account

1. Make sure the IrisVision device is charged before proceeding. When charging is complete, power the device on.
2. Remove the IrisVision Display Unit from the headset.
3. Access the IrisVision Manager app on the Display Unit (for instructions, see “Configuring Wi-Fi” on page 15).
4. Look for the “Amazon Account” option.
 - a. Check “Confirm your age”, and then proceed to Setup Amazon Account.
 - b. Enter your username and password from your existing Amazon account.
 - c. You will be prompted to allow Amazon to connect to your device. Select Allow, and it returns to the “Amazon Account” section in IrisVision Manager.
5. Your setup is complete. Press the Home button to return to the IrisVision app (allow about 10 seconds).

Creating a New Amazon Account

1. Make sure the device is charged before proceeding. After it is charged, you can power the device on if it is not already on.
2. Remove the IrisVision Display Unit from the headset.
3. Access the IrisVision Manager app on the Display Unit (for instructions, see “Configuring Wi-Fi” on page 15).
4. Look for the “Amazon Account” option.
 - a. Check “Confirm your age”, and then proceed to Setup Amazon Account.
 - b. Select “Create a new Amazon Account” on the bottom of the screen.
 - c. Fill out the form with your name, email address, and a new password for your Amazon account, and then select “Create your Amazon Account”.
 - d. It should take you to a page that will ask if you will allow Amazon to connect to your device. Press “Allow it”.
 - e. It will then ask for the location of the country you are in. Select the correct country based on your location.
 - f. After this step, it should redirect you back to the “Amazon Account” section in the IrisVision Manager app.
5. Your setup is complete. Press the Home button to return to the main IrisVision app.

IrisVision Modes

Scene Mode

Scene mode is the default Live View mode. This mode replicates the vivid colors and contrast of the scenery in front of you.

Experience a brighter image with auto focus and zoom in up to 14 times magnification.

Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- **Say “Scene”**

Scene Mode with Bubble



Scene mode with Bubble allows you to increase magnification within a section of your screen. This prevents you from losing the context of your surroundings.

1. Increase Bubble Size: Swipe up from the bottom of the touchpad to increase the size of the bubble.
2. Decrease Bubble Size: Swipe down from the top of the touchpad to decrease the size of the bubble.
3. Magnify Bubble: Swipe towards your ear to increase magnification inside the bubble. Swipe away from your ear to decrease magnification inside the bubble. Any changes you make to magnification in this mode will occur only in the bubble.

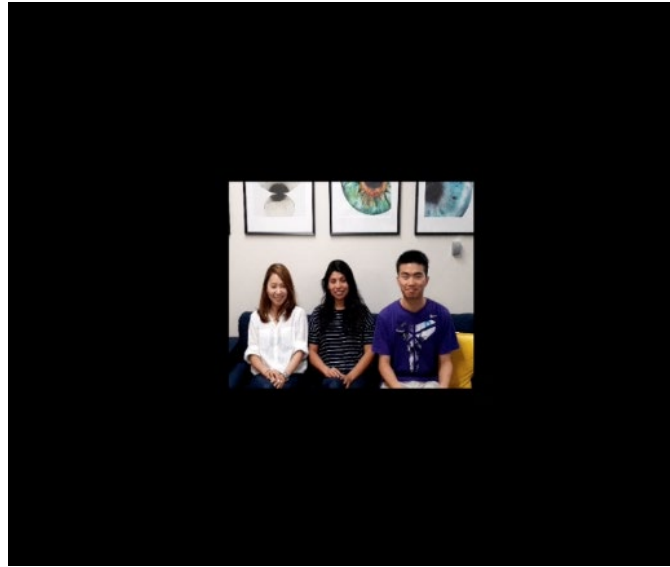
Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- Say “Scene with Bubble”

RP (Retinitis Pigmentosa)



If you are living with Retinitis Pigmentosa or Glaucoma and have reduced peripheral vision, your Field of View (FOV)—the area in which you can see objects in front of you—may be very small. You see only a portion of what a person with normal vision sees.

RP mode allows you to change the size of the FOV such that all objects are inside your viewing area, as shown in the example image above.

To accommodate your needs and obtain optimal viewing, adjust the size of the FOV as follows:

1. Increase the FOV (make the image larger) by swiping up on the touchpad.
2. Decrease the FOV (make the image smaller) by swiping down on the touchpad.

NOTE: You can also zoom in on a particular object or entity within your FOV. For more information, see “Using IrisVision: Step 5 – Zoom In and Zoom Out” on page 32.

Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- **Say “RP”**

Television

Television mode is great for viewing the display on your television or computer screen. To optimize your viewing experience and camera lighting, it is best to be centered in front of the screen when using this mode.

Television uses the camera's exposure compensation to provide the best viewing experience. Use the appropriate voice command to modify this setting.

There are 6 available settings: theater (default setting), very dark, dark, dim, ambient, and bright. Television has defined presets for up to 3 different televisions.

For instructions on saving presets for your television, see "Television Mode Voice Commands" on page 43.

TIPS:

- The headset will not go to sleep in Television mode, unless you set it on a charging pad. Otherwise, it will stay on until the battery is depleted.
- To watch Television for long periods of time, use the magnetic braided power cable connected to an external cell phone battery (not provided). DO NOT use this cord to charge your headset. For information on using the magnetic braided power cable, see "Powering the IrisVision Using the Magnetic Braided Power Cable" on page 22.

Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- Say “Television”

Bioptic



Bioptic mode positions a viewfinder at the top center of the screen that allows you to magnify a specific section without losing the greater context of the view in front of you.

1. Turn your head to place the viewfinder in the center of the screen to an area you wish to have magnified. This view will be enlarged in the upper portion of the screen.
2. Adjust magnification within the viewfinder on your screen. Swipe horizontally towards your ear to increase magnification. Swipe away from your ear to decrease magnification.
3. You can re-position the viewfinder using voice commands or the Configuration menu.
 - To move the viewfinder using voice commands, say “**Bottom**” to move it to the bottom of the screen. To move it back to the top, say “**Top**”.

Bioptic – continued

- You can also re-position the viewfinder using the Configuration menu. For more information, please refer to the Configuration Guide or contact Customer Support by email at support@irisvision.com or by phone at +1-855-207-6665 for assistance.

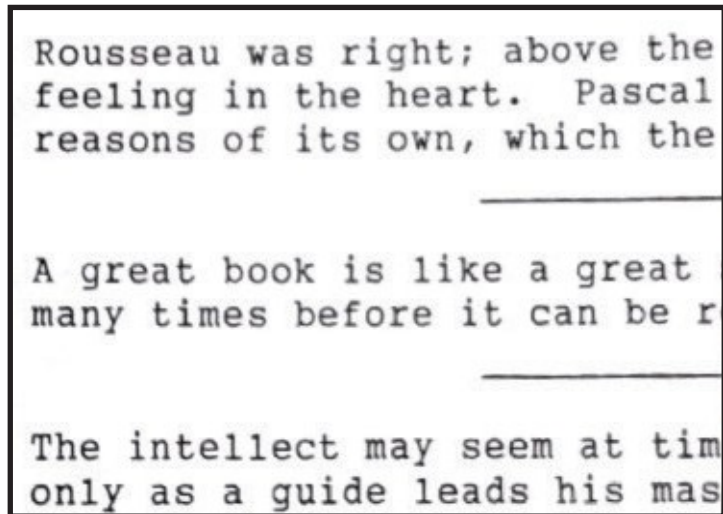
Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- Say “Bioptic”

Reading



Reading mode presents reading material with black letters on a white background. It is best for reading text material such as books or papers without color.

NOTE: For reading magazines or materials with color, it is best to return to Scene mode.

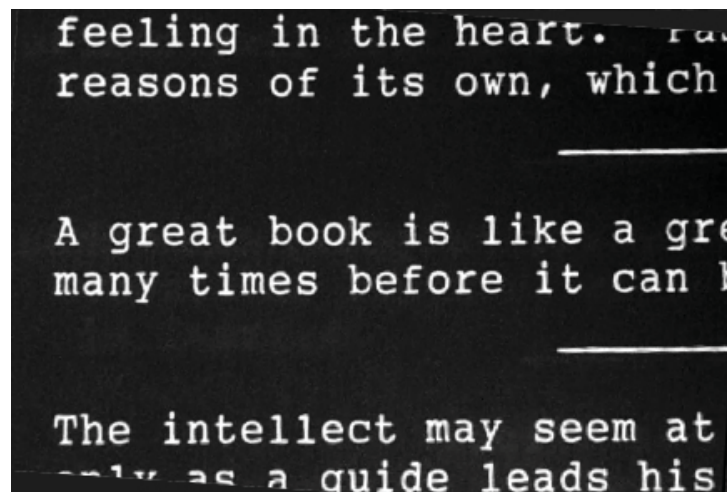
Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- Say “Reading”

Reading Inverted



Reading Inverted mode is a variation of Reading mode which provides white letters on a black background.

This enhances the contrast and provides reduced glare on the screen, which can be helpful to those overwhelmed by bright scenes.

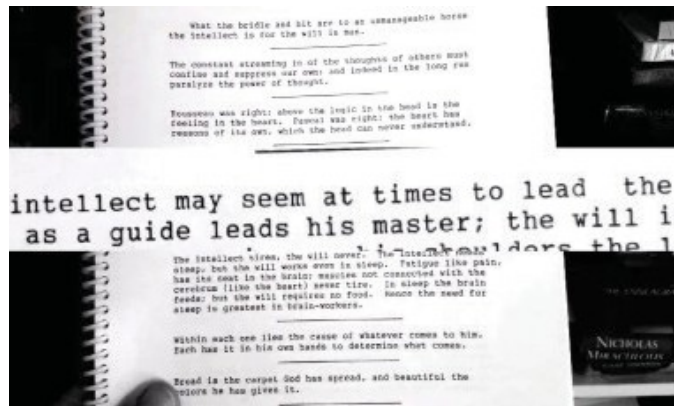
Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.



Double Tap on the Touchpad

- Say "Reading Inverted"

Reading Line



Reading Line mode presents text in black letters on a white background. It also provides a magnification bar in the center of the screen to magnify one or more lines of text while allowing a normal view above and below the bar. Increase the size of the reading line by slowly swiping up on the touchpad. Swipe down on the touchpad to decrease the size of the reading line.

1. It is best to make the reading line window large at first. Make the text large enough to read it by swiping towards your ear to zoom in.
2. Try adjusting the size of the window to isolate 1 line or 2 lines of text. This prevents common reading mistakes such as reading the same line twice or skipping a line.

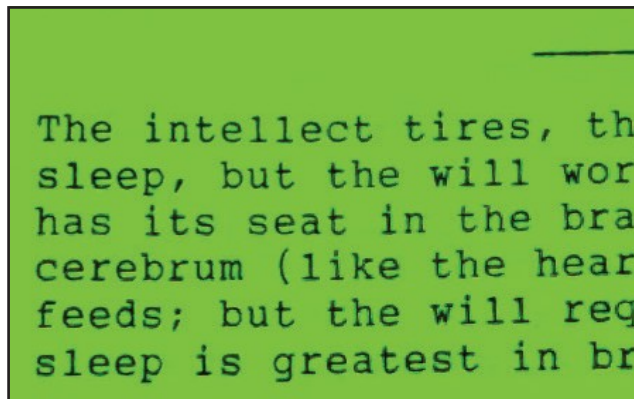

Reading Green



Reading Green mode is a variation of Reading mode which shows black text on a green background. This may also help reading by providing better screen contrast without the brightness of a white background.

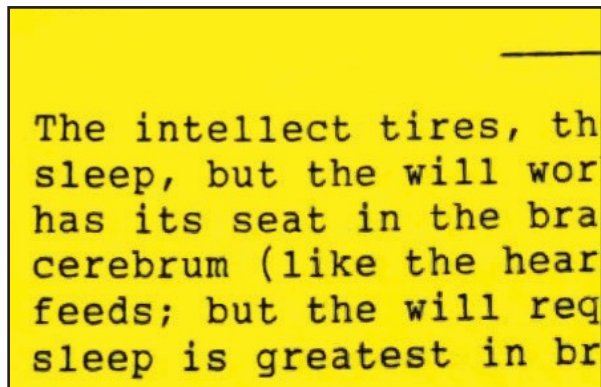

Reading Yellow



Reading Yellow mode is a variation of Reading mode which shows black text on a yellow background. It increases screen contrast without the brightness of a white background and is helpful when reading for extended periods of time.

Wait for the beep or microphone to appear before saying the word or phrase.

IrisReader

IrisReader uses Optical Character Recognition (OCR) to display captured text to the reader and will read it aloud one word at a time. The word being spoken is highlighted on the display.

1. Cycle to IrisReader mode and center the text you would like to have read on the screen. If possible, bring the reading material within about 8-10 inches from your headset, making sure the text is not cut off on either side of the screen.
2. Press the Snapshot button to capture the text.
3. Pause the readout by pressing the Snapshot button once.
4. Resume readout by pressing the Snapshot button again.
5. Swipe towards you on the touchpad to rewind the readout.
6. Swipe away from you on the touchpad to fast-forward the readout.
7. Swipe up on the touchpad to increase the font size.
8. Swipe down on the touchpad to decrease the font size.
9. To stop the readout at any time, press the Mode button.

Photo Gallery

Photo Gallery mode allows you to view snapshots you have saved. The images are stored on the headset and can be exported to your computer. Please contact Customer Support by email at support@irisvision.com or by phone at +1-855-207-6665 for assistance.

1. In Photo Gallery mode, select a photo by swiping on the touchpad. The selected picture will be highlighted with a yellow border. You can also use the voice commands “**Next photo**” or “**Previous photo**” to navigate through the photos.
2. Open the highlighted photo by tapping the touchpad once. It will appear in full screen view. (Another option is to use the voice commands. For more information, see “Voice Commands” on page 38.)
3. Magnify the selected photo by swiping away from you or by swiping up.
4. Decrease magnification within the selected photo by swiping towards you or by swiping down.
5. Pan within the photo by moving your head left, right, up, and down to capture the entire picture. To reset the photo to the center, use the voice command “**Reset photo**”.
6. To exit the photo in full screen view, press the Mode button once.
7. Delete a photo by first selecting it from the gallery. When it is displayed full screen, press on the touchpad for 3 seconds to activate the delete prompt. Swipe up to delete the photo and swipe down to return to the gallery.

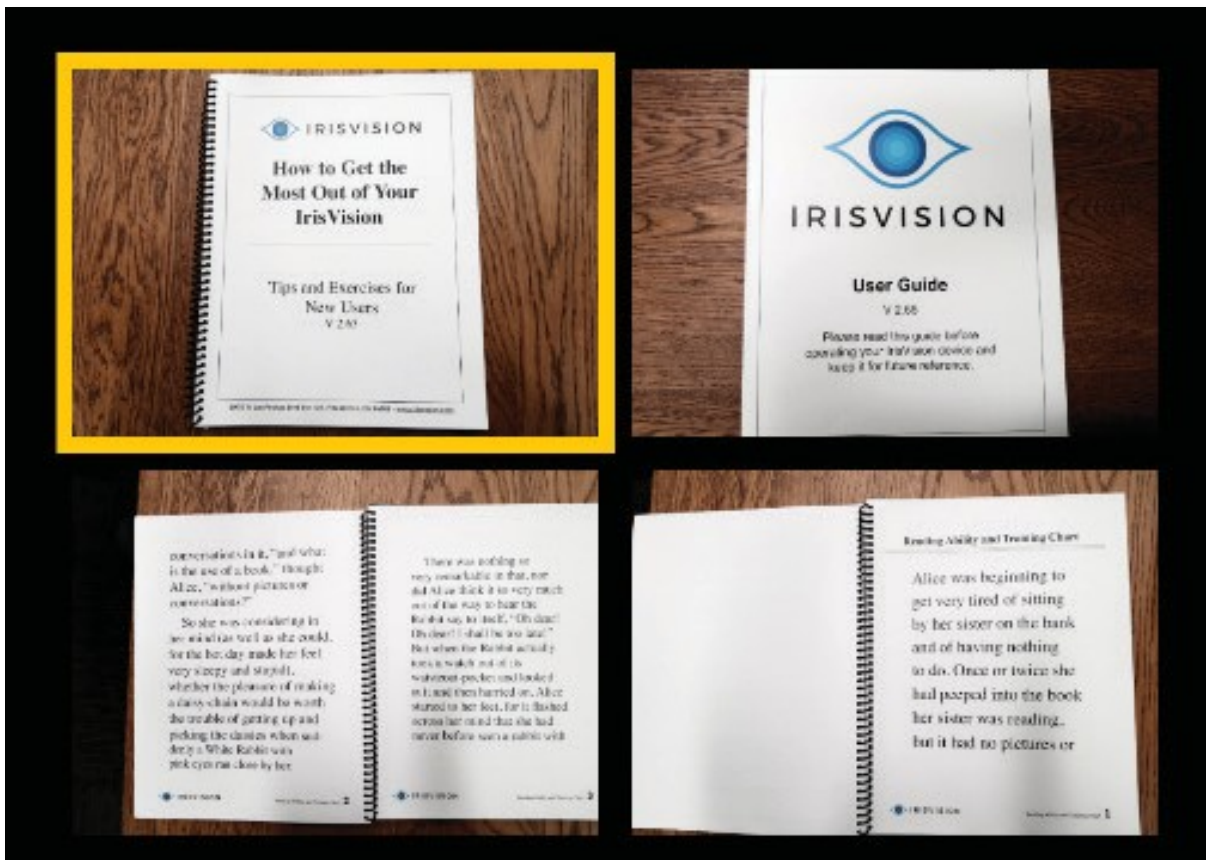

Video Player

Video Player mode enables you to stream YouTube videos when connected to Wi-Fi. The Video Player features voice-enabled search, so you can easily find, play, pause and even magnify videos using voice commands.

1. **Playlists:** When you first enter Video Player you will see a curated playlist of “News” videos. You can use the touchpad to swipe towards you or away from you to navigate to the other available playlists. You can also use voice commands to navigate directly to one of those categories. There are 3 categories: News, Entertainment, and IrisVision which refer to the playlists of videos we have on our IrisVision YouTube channel.
2. Scroll through the list of available videos by swiping up and down on the touchpad. The video in focus should be highlighted yellow.
3. Select the highlighted video by tapping once on the touchpad.
4. **Field of View (FOV):** Swipe up on the touchpad to increase the Field of View of the video and swipe down to decrease it.
5. Fast-Forward in the video by swiping away from you
6. Rewind a video by swiping towards you.
7. **Pause and Resume:** Tap the touchpad once to pause the video. To resume playing, tap the touchpad a second time.
8. Return to the video list by pressing the Mode button once. To cycle to the next mode, press the Mode button a second time.

Video Player – continued

9. Search: Double tap the touchpad to activate voice search. Say, “**Search**” and then say the title or description of a video. For example, say “**Search cats**” to see videos of cats. After you have performed a search, you can still swipe laterally to navigate through the list of playlists. Video Player will save the search query to another Search playlist so you can go back to your searched videos in that session.

NOTE: The Search playlist saves only one query at a time; if you say “**Search cats**” and then say “**Search dogs**” the Search playlist will only show the “**Search dogs**” playlist. You will have to search for cats again to show those videos.

10. Bookmark Videos: You can save YouTube videos to a Bookmark playlist and watch them later. You can also remove the videos from the bookmark when you are finished using them.



Video Player – continued

How to Bookmark Videos

- Search for a new video you would like to watch
- Scroll down to highlight the video you would like to watch and tap once on the touchpad to select it.
- While the video is playing, or when the video has finished playing, press the Snapshot button to activate a save prompt. Swipe up to save the video. You can also use the voice command, “save video”, to perform the same action. Alternatively, on the scroll list screen, if you have the video highlighted you can use a voice command to activate the save prompt by using the command “save video”. To access the Bookmark playlist, double tap and say, “**Show saved videos**”, or swipe laterally to navigate to the new Bookmark playlist. The video you saved should show up in its own list. The Bookmark playlist will now be displayed first over the News playlist next time you navigate to Video Player.

How to Remove Bookmarked Videos

To remove a bookmarked video, press the Snapshot button while watching the video you want to remove. When prompted to remove the video, swipe up to confirm.

- **Bubble Size.** We recommend keeping the bubble size between 20-30% while zooming in on different objects. Keeping the bubble size in this range will provide a better view of the surrounding environment. When you have identified the object of interest, you can increase the magnification inside the bubble by swiping towards you on the touchpad. The bubble feature is only available in the Scene mode with Bubble.

- **Reading.** Hold your reading material in front of you in a normal reading position and move your head, not your arms, to scan the text. Bring the reading material as close as possible to you (approximately 6 inches away). For heavy books or reading materials, you may consider using a bookstand if you are sitting at a table or desk to keep the reading material steady. A reading light may also help.

Recommendations for Use – continued

- **Auto-Focus.** The IrisVision has a camera with automatic focus. The camera may take 1- 2 seconds to adjust its focus on an object. If the camera fails to focus on an object, look away and then back at the object.
- **Sleep Mode.** Any time you take off the headset and set it down, the headset will go into Sleep mode and the screen will turn black. This conserves battery power. Turn the screen back on by putting the headset on and pressing the Mode button. **The headset will not enter Sleep mode when in Television mode.** It is recommended that you power off the IrisVision unit when not in use. To do this, press and hold down the white tab on top of the headset for 5 seconds.

Cleaning Tips for Your IrisVision Headset

- Wipe the outer parts of the headset with a dry, soft cloth or wipe. The touchpad can collect the oil from your fingers as you operate the headset, so wiping down at least once a week is recommended.
- Remove the phone from the headset and wipe it down with a dry, soft cloth or wipe. Dust particles and smudges can collect on the screen or camera lens.
- Wipe down the lens bubbles on the inside and outside of the headset to remove dust particles and smudges.
- The foam lining of the headset that presses up against your face and the straps that go around your head can be removed for cleaning. Run them under warm water, use a mild soap to scrub, and then rinse and air dry them.
- If you use a lens cleaner, we recommend that you spray it on the cloth first, and then wipe down the headset.

How to Turn Off Your Headset

1. Press and hold down the white tab on top of the headset for 7 seconds. You will hear 4 beeps to confirm that the headset is about to power off.
2. The screen will soon turn black and the unit will power off. You can then put it away.
3. To turn your IrisVision back on, press and hold down the white tab for 5 seconds until you feel the button vibrate. It will take about 45 seconds to reboot fully, and then Focus mode will appear. Your IrisVision is ready for use.
